

STATUTE ASSOCIATION SUFI EARTH SPIRIT, ARTICLE 2

ART.2 PURPOSE AND SOCIAL OBJECTIVE

The association pursues civic, solidarity and social utility goals on a non-profit basis, through the performance of one or more activities of general interest with reference to Art. 5 of Legislative Decree 117/2017, including:

- Environment: Interventions and services aimed at safeguarding and improving environmental conditions and the use of natural resources, with the exception of the usual activities of collection and recycling of urban, special and hazardous waste (letter e)
- Culture: Organisation and management of cultural, artistic and recreational activities of social interest, including publishing activities promoting and disseminating the practice of volunteering (letter i).

The association pursues exclusively social solidarity objectives.

It intends to operate in the environmental and cultural sectors, promoting the development of a better quality of life, well-being and human, spiritual and physical maturation of the individual in their entirety of mind, body and soul, while at the same time being in harmony with the environment, eco-sustainable and fair trade, enhancing and protecting nature and at the same time fulfilling the social function of human maturation and development through personal growth, greater awareness and attention in the relationship with nature, plants, animals, people - one's fellow human beings and oneself - and natural resources.

In order to achieve its goals, the association carries out the following activities:

- Serving as a meeting place in a setting typical of the Gallura landscape, fulfilling the social function of reconnecting with nature, the landscape and the culture of the area;
- Organising and holding courses, group events and collective activities, as well as silent retreats, with a particular focus on:
 - teaching and promoting a healthy, eco-sustainable and fair and equitable lifestyle;
 - the deep ecology movement, with particular attention to the traditional wisdom of Gallura;
 - meditation practices based on different approaches and traditions, in particular deep ecology and Sufi wisdom and their profound vision of nature.
- Enabling people to experience the typical Gallura nature surrounding the association's headquarters with all their senses and to enter into deep harmony with it through various activities, including environmental and landscape protection.
- Organise excursions to experience close contact with nature by exploring the surroundings, i.e. the landscape, natural monuments, archaeological sites, ancient places of worship, churches and Gallura villages with their traditional events. The aim is to preserve the ancient culture of the local area.

- Serving as a meeting place, fulfilling the social function of human maturation and growth through the ideal of personal development and inner growth;
- Collaborating and promoting joint initiatives with organisations, institutions and associations that pursue similar goals.

Pursuant to Article 6 of the Third Sector Code, the association may carry out activities other than those of general interest, which are secondary and instrumental to the latter, according to criteria and limits defined by a specific Ministerial Decree.

The activities referred to in Article 6 of Legislative Decree No. 117 of 3 July 2017 are considered secondary to activities of general interest if, in each financial year, one of the following conditions is met:

- a) the related revenues do not exceed 30% of the total revenues of the third sector entity;
- b) the related revenues do not exceed 66% of the total costs of the third sector entity.

The body responsible for identifying the above activities is the Board of Directors, which must justify the subsidiary or instrumental nature of any activities carried out.

The association may also carry out fundraising activities pursuant to Article 7 of Legislative Decree No. 117/2017.

The above activities may be carried out by the association through the voluntary efforts of its members, free of charge. Flat-rate reimbursements are not permitted; only reimbursements for expenses actually incurred and documented are allowed.

Volunteers must be insured against accidents and illnesses related to the performance of voluntary activities, as well as for civil liability towards third parties.

The association may hire employees or make use of self-employed or other types of work in accordance with Article 16 of Legislative Decree No. 117 of 3 July 2017.

The Executive Committee shall ensure the substantial publicity and transparency of the acts relating to the association's activities, with particular reference to the annual financial statements or reports and the mandatory association books, i.e. the membership book, the book of meetings and resolutions of the Members' Meeting, the Executive Committee and, if elected, the Supervisory Body.
